- A. <u>Psalm 127</u>: God works, God makes our work meaningful; God rewards our work for Him; The growth of a family is God's work; God's blessing on a city begins with His blessing on the family; The growth of a family is slow, unspectacular, and unnoticed, but according to the biblical pattern of God working over time "slowly but surely;" and we cannot raise our family without God.
- B. How to Raise Kids without Raising Cain: Proverbs 22:6; 29:15

 - a. Jen Piaget, B.F. Skinner and Behaviorism children are born essentially good, innocent, with a highly impressionable psyche that can be permanently scarred or "broken," a neutral slate given the right environment will grow up to be good.

 "in the way he should go" (in your Bible there should be a small #1) = "according to HIS way." Ancient Hebrew says "on the mouth of his way." Proverbs 29:15, "gets his own way" is same Hebrew phrase. "Train up" = "setting aside, narrowing in." WARNING: If a child is left to himself, to go his own way, do his own thing, rebelling against parental instruction and discipline, he will be trained by his parents to be a shameful young person and a shameful adult. Taking a ______, hands off, uninvolved approach to parenting will only result in shame for your child. If you don't parent, your child will be left at the mercy of his own sinful passions and urges.

Proverbs 20:11 – known by his actions.

Proverbs 22:15 - not naturally wise

Proverbs 29:15 – needs instruction and discipline


- a. A Unified Parenting Agreement: Parents on the Same Page with Biblical Roles of Husband and Wife Being Modeled.
