## A Study of God through the Life of Ruth Sunday, April 24, Previous Sermon Review

- I. Scene #1: The Wedding Plans Ruth 3:1-6
  - 1. We learn about priorities.
  - 2. We learn about God's purpose for marriage.
  - 3. We learn that because God is sovereign, every marriage is an "arranged marriage."
  - 4. We learn about our need for a redeemer.

    Boaz is a "type" of Christ as Boaz was a redeemer for Ruth, Naomi, and Naomi's property, so Christ is our Redeemer.
  - 5. We learn that God's sovereign control doesn't negate human responsibility; God works through the choices of His people to accomplish His good plans. (Acts 2:23)

      - b. God is pleased when people take redemption seriously.
