- I. Scene #1: The Wedding Plans      Ruth 3:1-6
  - 1. We learn about priorities.
  - 2. We learn about God’s purpose for marriage.
  - 3. We learn that because God is sovereign, every marriage is an “arranged marriage.”
  - 4. We learn about our need for a redeemer.  
Boaz is a “type” of Christ – as Boaz was a redeemer for Ruth, Naomi, and Naomi’s property, so Christ is our Redeemer.
  - 5. We learn that God’s sovereign control doesn’t negate human responsibility; God works through the choices of His people to accomplish His good plans. (Acts 2:23)
- A. Scene #1:    The Wedding Plans in Ruth 3:1-6
  - 1. Naomi demonstrated love for Ruth (3:1-4).
    - a. True love focuses on the needs of the other person.
    - b. True love takes action to meet those needs.
  - 2. Ruth demonstrated love for Naomi (3:5-6).
    - a. Ruth is not desperate for a man.
    - b. Ruth is determined to do all she can to see the LORD’s plan accomplished.
  - 3. Ruth and Naomi demonstrated love for the LORD.
    - a. God is pleased when people take marriage seriously.
    - b. God is pleased when people take redemption seriously.
