Impediments to Excellence: (**Ruth 3:11; 2:1**)

1. Laziness - *“All day long the sluggard craves for more, but his hands refuse to work.”* **Proverbs 21:25-26**
2. Worldliness; Love of Comfort; Procrastination; Lack of self-discipline or self-control; excuses; blame-shifting.
3. Dreaming too big - *“I do not concern myself with great matters, or with things too wonderful for me.”* **Ps. 131**
