Greetings from Villeurbanne! I know that I am long overdue in sending out news. I can't believe that five weeks have passed since I returned to France after my home ministries when I had the joy of visiting supporters in California, Utah, Texas, Ohio, Indiana and family in Arizona. (I trekked through 11 airports so I'm especially grateful for safety in travel). MERCI BEAUCOUP for your hospitality, your prayers, your sacrificial giving and your encouragements. I wish I could have seen everyone, but time just did not permit. If I missed seeing you I am truly sorry and hope we can connect next time.

Ladies Bible study - As you can imagine, when I returned I "hit the ground running." It was joy to start up a new year with the ladies Bible study group just 5 days after my return. This year we are studying Romans. I'm so glad for the "good news" of the Gospel after the bleak picture Paul paints of our desperate need – there is not one who does good and all are under the wrath and judgment of God. We'll look more closely



at the "good news" in our next study: "all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus" (Rom. 3:24).

House group – The Lyon East house group started up a few days after the first ladies Bible study. We had a nice time of fellowship touching bases after a busy summer. I gave a reminder of our goals and purpose, and we were able to pray for one another. From our last meeting through December we are looking at the biblical metaphors that help us to understand the church and our relationships, including our privileges and responsibilities. We've had to be flexible and adjust meeting dates because of holidays (Armistice and Christmas). Joëlle has volunteered to accompany us with her guitar as we try to be better at incorporating worship songs - not our strong point! Please continue to pray for those who have not yet professed Christ. We are missing Josiane who moved to Ghent, Belgium this summer, but are rejoicing that God provided a job for her. (Did you know that there are a total of 12 house groups with around 125-150 participating?)

In partnership with Action Biblique, we also have our sights on another area in which to plant a church, Caluire and Croix Rousse, northeast of Lyon. Pray also for activities that I don't mention often because I'm not directly involved that strengthen and edify believers: Sunday school for children, youth groups, women's and men's meetings, Scouts, gathering of medical students and medical professionals; and Bible study in Revelation (led by colleague Mark Sims).

Chateau of Saint Albain – Praise God for Nicolas Alfonso, who began as the new director of the Chateau on



September 1. He with his wife Nancy and their two young children (with #3 on the way) moved into the gate house on the property shortly after he assumed his responsibilities. (Some of you may have met Nicolas as he participated in three of the dinners for the future funding of the Chateau in Ohio and Indiana.) -- Pray for good teamwork with the current team comprised of Bruce & Karen Beck and Claire Martin.

They're all working hard and doing a good job at serving the groups who come for retreats, training, evangelism, prayer, etc. -- Pray as I continue to give oversight of the accounting and that I can give adequate, timely reports that will be helpful in future planning and projections. -- Pray for the 2-year transition team that has been put into place by Encompass, owner of the property, to formulate plans for evangelism among youth, upgrading the facility, sustainable financing and future direction (next generation). - Pray for the annual Live Nativity and Christmas market December 9-11. Up to 1600 visitors in one weekend have come in past years to hear the true story of Christmas.
