→Grandma knew best when she said: “If you can’t say something good about someone, then don’t say anything at all”

→THE BIG IDEA: a person with a genuine living faith does not badmouth his brother

→This isn’t the first time that James has spoken to us about our mouth:

- 1:26 If anyone thinks himself to be religious and yet not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man’s religion is worthless
- 3:2 If anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man able to bridle the whole body as well
- 3:6 the tongue is a fire, the very world of iniquity...sets on fire the course of life
- 3:8 No one can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil and full of deadly poison

1. The REBUKE of their behavior- James 4:11a “Do not speak against one another”

2. The REASON for the rebuke- James 4:11b ”He who speaks against a brother, or judges his brother, speaks against the law and judges the law”

3. The RESULT of their behavior- James 4:11c “If you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law, but a judge of it”

- Eph 4:32 Be _____ to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you
- Col 4:6 Let your speech always be with _____=, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person.

2. How do you measure up? Is there a behavior to change? Something to confess?

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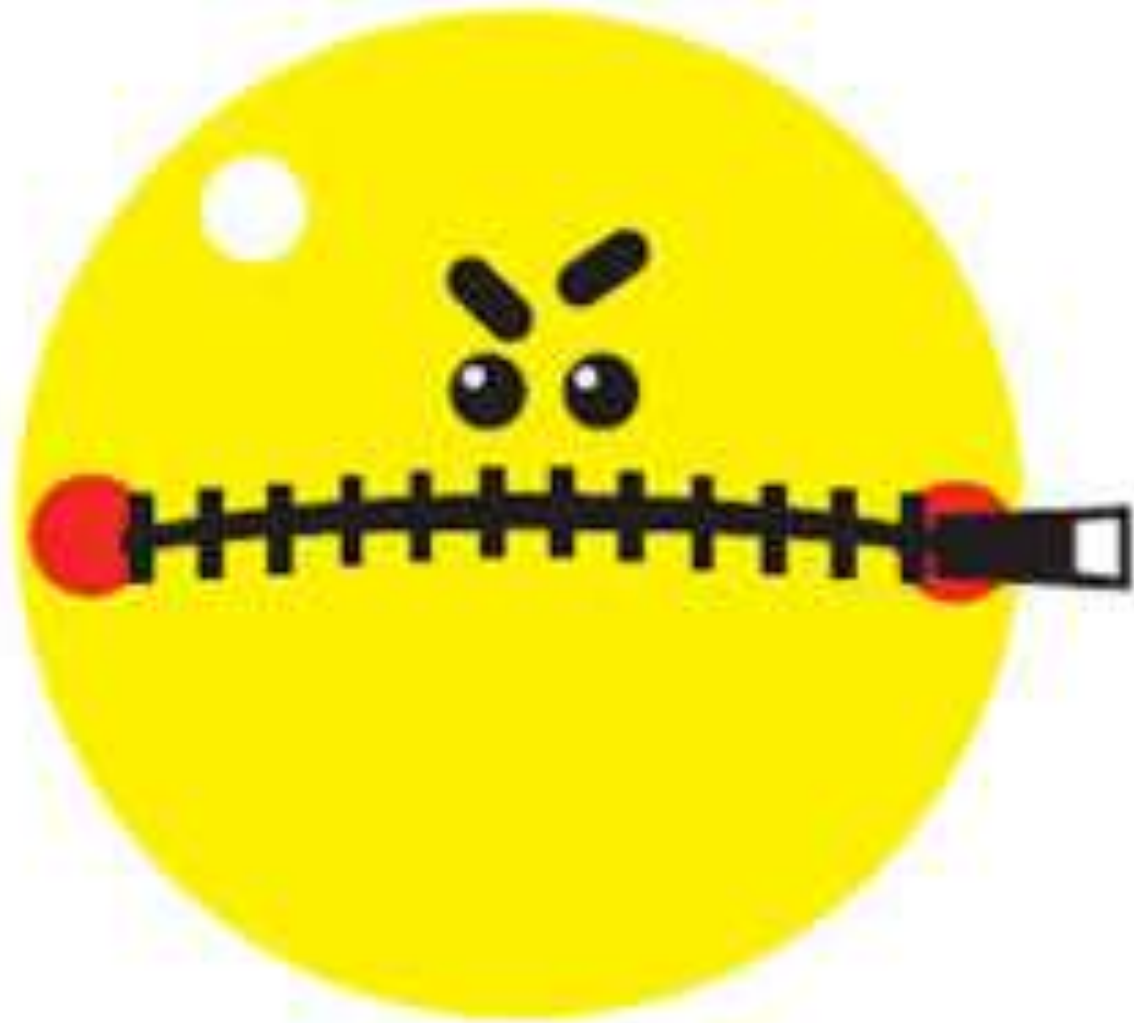
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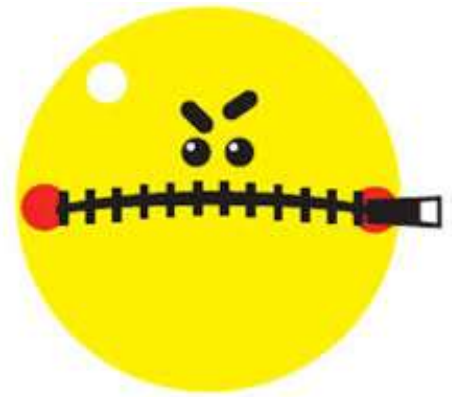
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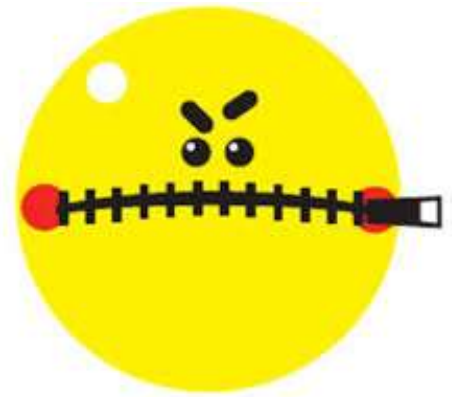


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Weapons and Strategies For Conflict

- Nuclear Attack: Being willing to sacrifice the church if the goals of my group are not met.

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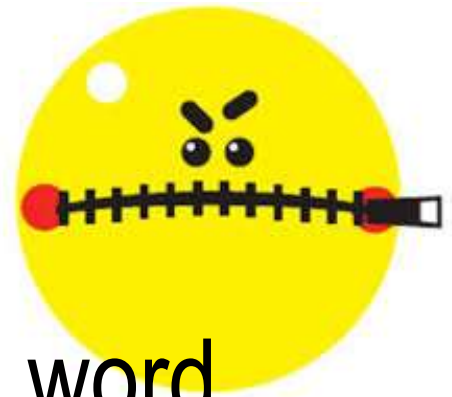
