Prepare for your Group discussion by taking some time (about 20-30 minutes) to go through the following Growth Group Questions and be ready to share your thoughts and answers with your group. Have a great time growing in your relationship with the Lord and with others!

1. Looking back at your sermon notes, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged or confused you?
2. Our hearts can be easily deceived by the desire for money. How have you seen that to be true in your life? Read 1 Timothy 6:8-10 and consider how the desire for money and the "stuff" that money buys has pulled your heart away from what it truly desires – more of God?
3. Read Deuteronomy 8:17-18, 1 Chronicles 29:14-17, and Hebrews 2:10a. Describe how hard it is to live as though everything you have, comes from God and belongs to Him.
4. Read Proverbs 30:8-9. How do you think a different financial situation would affect your relationship with Jesus? Be honest with yourself!
5. Where do you try to draw the line between enjoying what God gives you and living a life of self-indulgence?
6. In the sermon, we heard about the freedom to be "spontaneously generous" with our money. How much do you feel that freedom? Why do you think that is?
7. Can you think of a story in which God gave you the resources to bless someone in a cool, unusual or even miraculous way?
8. What are some specific ways God might be calling you into a greater freedom with your money – to honor Him more with your money?

- **What exactly is GREED?**

Greed is rightly called a deadly sin because **it kills the possibility of a proper human relation to the Creator.**

¹ *Now listen, you rich people, weep and wail because of the misery that is coming on you.*

“Weep,” klausate = “to sob out loud,” it’s not a silent crying.

It means “to weep in a lamenting way.”

As a result of trusting money and material possessions and not in GOD

² *Your wealth has rotted, and moths have eaten your clothes.* ³ *Your gold and silver are corroded.*

They were depending on material possessions and money as if life depended on them

⁴ Look! The wages you failed to pay the workers who mowed your fields are crying out against you. The cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord Almighty.

⁵ You have lived on earth in luxury and self-indulgence. You have fattened yourselves in the day of slaughter. ⁶ You have condemned and murdered the innocent one, who was not opposing you.....

¹⁹ "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. ²⁰ But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

How to checklist:
