- c. WHILE HE WAS RECEIVING THIS NEWS, ANOTHER SERVANT COMES IN TO REPORT THAT THE FIRE OF GOD HAD STRUCK ALL HIS SHEEP AND THE SERVANTS WATCHING OVER THEM, AND THEY WERE ALL GONE.

Luke 8:13

¹³*Those on the rocky soil are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no firm root; they believe for a while, and in time of testing fall away.*

"Time" is *kairos*, it's not *chronos*.

Kairos = A circumstance, or a destined time, or a moment of Test Adversity.

James 1:3

³*For you know that when "your faith is tested"*

adversity always tests your faith.

Trials cannot destroy true faith, **because true faith is a gift from God, and true saving faith is forever.**

Job

"Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him."

adversity cannot destroy true faith; but it can test it.

True faith can't be destroyed by adversity, it endures, it perseveres right through the **adversity**.

That's the nature of true faith.

God bringing **adversities** into our life is not destroying our faith, He's manifesting it.
