"In trouble by Choice" - Jonah 1-2

Suffering is a part of life.

We are not entitled to perfect lives. Adversity does not discriminate. It's important to change the knee-jerk reaction mindset of "why me?" into one that says, "why not me?" Terrible things happen to so many of us, "now's the time to sink or swim."

Let's look at some observations from Jonah 1-2 about how to get in trouble by choice:

I. There was a clear *C* from God. V.1

Ionah 1

1 The Lord gave this message to Jonah son of Amittai: ² "Get up and go to the great city of Nineveh. Announce my judgment against it because I have seen how wicked its people are."

Let me give you a couple of examples:

1. The bible says:

Galatians 6:1

Dear brothers and sisters, if another believer is overcome by some sin, <u>you who are godly should gently and humbly help that person</u> back onto the right path. And be careful not to fall into the same temptation yourself.

Matthew 18:15

"If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back.

2. The bible says:

2 Cor. 6:14-18
