Acts 2:42-47.

⁴² All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.
⁴³ A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. ⁴⁴ And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. ⁴⁵ They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. ⁴⁶ They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity— ⁴⁷ all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

Because Jesus first loved us, we compassionately love others

I. <u>Why</u> Love?

a. Because it is the Great <u>C</u>. Love God - Love People.

Matthew 22:37-39. When Jesus was asked what was most important, He said, "Jesus replied, "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' And: 'Love your neighbor as yourself."

1 John 4:20

²⁰ If someone says, "I love God," but hates a fellow believer, that person is a liar; for if we don't love people we can see, how can we love God, whom we cannot see?

⁷ Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. ⁸ <u>But anyone who</u> <u>does not love</u> does not know God, for God is love.

b. Because God <u>P</u> His love into us for us to share.

Romans 5:5

And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. **poured out** ekjéo = spill

c. Because when you love, you have the <u>A</u> that you belong to Jesus.

John 13:34-36. ³⁴ So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other ³⁵ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

d. Because only when you love you can be <u>C</u>like Jesus.

Matthew 9:36 When he saw the crowds, <u>he had compassion on them</u> because they were <u>confused and helpless</u>, like sheep without a shepherd.

II. <u>How</u> can you show this love with <u>compassion</u>?

Love must be shown with actions 1 John 3:18. ¹⁸ Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with <u>actions and in truth.</u>

a. <u>S</u>acts.

Philippians 2:3-4

³ Nothing should be done because of pride or thinking about yourself. Think of other people as more important than yourself. ⁴ Do not always be thinking about your own plans only. Be happy to know what other people are doing.

b. Speak with <u>K</u>

Colossians 4:6. "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone".

Proverbs 12:18. The words of the reckless pierce like swords, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

c. Learn to <u>L</u>

Psalm 18:6 In my distress I called on the Lord and cried for help to my God; He heard my voice from His temple, and my cry for help came before Him to His ears.

d. Don't <u>J</u> people.

Matthew 7:1-4

7 "Do not judge others, and you will not be judged.² For you will be treated as you treat others. The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be judged.

e. <u>"E</u> others to do good things".

Hebrews 10:24-25

²⁴ Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. ²⁵ And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.

f. <u>A</u> or ask for forgiveness when you make a mistake or offend anyone.

James 5:16

¹⁶ Tell your sins to each other. And pray for each other so you may be healed. The prayer from the heart of a man right with God has much power.

g. Treat others in the same way you want be T

Mat. 7:12

¹² "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you. This is the essence of all that is taught in the law and the prophets.

Luke 6:32-36 ³² "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? <u>Even sinners love those who love them</u>. ³³ And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? Even sinners do that.
