→ Is it really true that “timing is everything”?

When *the fullness of the time* came,
God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law
(Gal 4:4)

Hope Is Always Found In God's Time

1. The **SITUATION** in Elizabeth's life vv5-7 HOPE IS DISAPPOINTED

→ What do we learn about Elizabeth here?

- -She is married to a priest and is from a family of priests “daughter of Aaron” v5
- -Her name Elizabeth means “”promise of God”
- -She was “righteous” and “walked blamelessly...” v6
- -BUT ... she was “barren” v7
- -She and her husband were “advanced in years” 7

→ What conclusions might we draw from this list?

2. The **SETTING** for God to work in Elizabeth's life vv8-22 HOPE IS DEMONSTRATED

-it involved her husband's ministry

→ Note the irony: a man with unanswered prayer at the altar of incense

-it included an angelic message: Lots of information in those brief words

- “your wife, Elizabeth”=
- “will bear”=
- “a son”=
- “you will give him the name John”=

→ We too often struggle to take God at His word and believe His promises...
especially in the midst of disappointment and discouragement

→ God is at work behind the scene to accomplish His purpose thru His people in His time!!

3. The **SOLUTION** to the prayer of Elizabeth's life vv23-25; 57-66

HOPE IS DELIVERED

- Elizabeth becomes pregnant
- She recognized that “the Lord has dealt with me” and “looked with favor upon me”
- The Lord had taken away her “disgrace among men”

→ God had chosen to use her lifelong disappointment to reveal Himself ... to display His power ... to provide the waymaker who would introduce the Messiah ... to call His people back to Himself

SO WHAT? NOW WHAT? TAKING IT HOME

1. God's time isn't my time but His time is always the right time
HOPE IS ALWAYS FOUND IN GOD'S TIME

2. God uses the disappointments and times of waiting to build qualities into our lives that make us more like Jesus

→ to keep us _____ on Him . . .
to keep us _____ ...
to keep us living by _____ not by sight

3. God's delays do not always mean God's denials

4. You can always trust God's timing . . . do you?

You can always trust God's timing because Hope is always found in HIS time

→ I love this old chorus:

In His time, in His time
He makes all things beautiful in **His time**
Lord, please show me everyday
As you're teaching me your way
That you do just what you say
In Your time.

In Your time, in Your time
You make all things beautiful in **Your time**
Lord, my life to you I bring
May each song I have to sing
Be to you a lovely thing
In Your time

HOPE IN TIME



The importance of “time” in Elizabeth’s life

- In **the days** of Herod v5
- they were both advanced in **years** v7
- the hour** of the incense offering v10
- my wife is advanced in **years** v18
- until **the day** when these things take place v20
- shall be fulfilled in their **proper time** v20
- the days** of his priestly service were ended v23
- after **these days** Elizabeth his wife became pregnant v24
- in seclusion **five months** v24
- the days** when He looked with favor upon me v25

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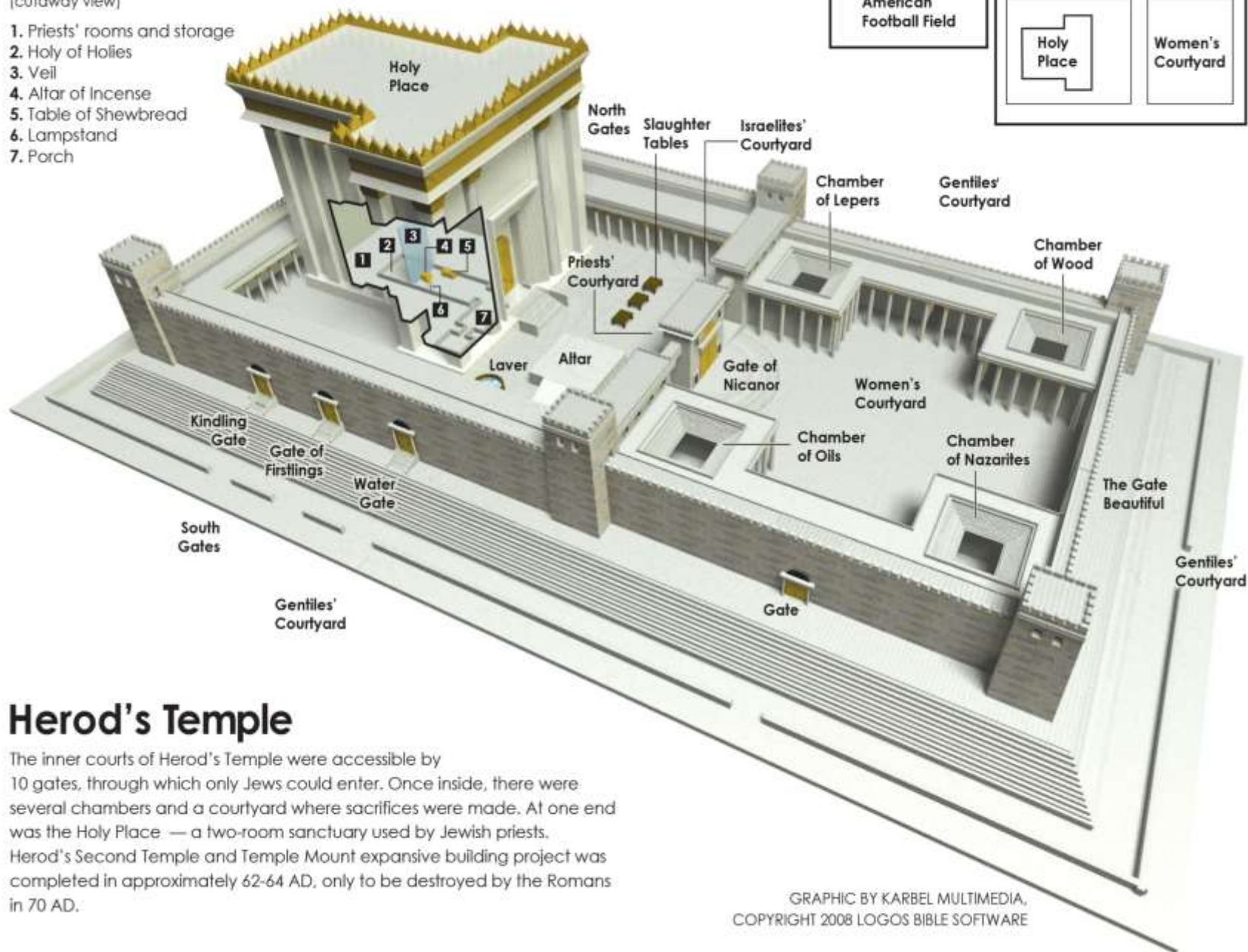
→ It involved her husband's ministry



INSIDE THE HOLY PLACE

(cutaway view)

1. Priests' rooms and storage
2. Holy of Holies
3. Veil
4. Altar of Incense
5. Table of Shewbread
6. Lampstand
7. Porch



Herod's Temple

The inner courts of Herod's Temple were accessible by 10 gates, through which only Jews could enter. Once inside, there were several chambers and a courtyard where sacrifices were made. At one end was the Holy Place — a two-room sanctuary used by Jewish priests. Herod's Second Temple and Temple Mount expansive building project was completed in approximately 62-64 AD, only to be destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD.

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Altar of Incense



Made of acacia wood
with pure gold overlay;
1.5 ft square
3 ft high
(Ex 30:1).

Fragrant incense was burned on
the altar every morning and
evening (Ex 30:7,8).

Placed in the outer sanctuary in front
of the mercy seat where the Lord
met the high priest (Ex 30:6).

Once a year the high priest would make
atonement for the altar by sprinkling
some of the blood of the sin offering on
the horns because the altar was "most
holy to the Lord" (Ex 30:10).

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→ It included an angel's message



Lots of information in the angel's words

“your wife, Elizabeth”

“will bear”

“a son”

“give name JOHN”

No substitutes

Not maybe; A promise!!

A boy; an heir

“God is gracious”
